Here are club price for the summer.

1. Ice will remain the same \$2.00 cubes & \$3.00 blocks. Please remember to put your money in the envelopes provided and drop in the slot on the gallery counter.

2. Small boat storage was set at 15% of

senior members dues or \$108.75. However for this year it was decided to hold price to 7.5% of senior members due or \$54.38. This to help offset the other increase small boat members are facing this year. Please check with Claire Gammo for your assigned space before remitting payment.

3. Dry dingy storage was set at 7.5% of senior members due or \$54.38 and wet storage was set at 15% of senior members dues or \$108.75. This way of setting the price for storage was voted at the July 2013 general membership meeting to standardize pricing going forward. Please check with Claire Gammo before sending in your payment to TYC PO Box 1808 New London, CT 06320.

4. If leaving your boat on the dock overnight the charge will be \$15.00/night again this year. Payment is to be made to the launch operator in advance. Transient space on the dock will be charged at \$50.00/night if space is available and collected by the launch operator.

- 5. Transient mooring are available at \$25.00/ night except on fireworks weekend. Fireworks weekend the cost will be \$35.00/night. Please have all transients check in the launch operator for mooring assignment.
- Don't forget that this year the mooring at Block Island is \$25.00/night but you are able to reserve it so you know it will

If you plan to attend the New London Cruise in June or the August cruise you need to follow the instructions listed for each cruise. 2014 SUMMER CRUISE SCHEDULE:

• June 14 to 15, 2014 – Cruise to New London – contact fleet caption ASAP if you are attending this cruise.

The Charles Morgan will be docked at New London during this weekend and the docks are not available. Ten moorings have been reserved for Saturday night, June 14. The price of a mooring is \$31.50/night. If you plan to attend the cruise I need you to complete a form for the cruise and pay TYC before the end of May. The form will be posted on the TYC website.

- July 19 and 20, 2014 Pirate rendezvous and cruise to Stonington Harbor, CT. – The Club will meet on Flat Hammock for the Pirate rendezvous on Saturday July 19. Boaters interested in extending their adventure will cruise to Stonington Harbor for a one to two night stay. Mooring are available at a cost at Dodson's or you can anchor for free in the harbor.
- <u>August 16 to 23, 2014 Cruise to Essex, CT, Dering Harbor,</u> <u>and Three Mile Harbor, NY.</u> – *Contact fleet caption ASAP if you are attending this cruise.*
- Aug 16 Sail to Essex, CT on the CT River. Stay Aug 16 and 17 on moorings at Brewers Dauntless Marina. Ten moorings are reserved at \$37.50/night. If you plan to stay at Brewer's you must contact the marina office at 860-767-8267 before April 31 with your credit card number. Ask for Cy Libby when calling.

Let Cy know you are with the TYC cruise to get the reduced mooring rate. Currently we are scheduled for dinner on Sunday night, August 17 at the Essex Corinthian Yacht Club.

Aug 18 – Sail to Dering Harbor, NY. We will stay in Dering Harbor August 18, 19, 20. Ten mooring are reserved at \$70.00/ night with the Shelter Island Yacht Club Dering Harbor offer a center point to explore Greenport to the north and Shelter Island and the South Fork of Long Island.

Aug 21 – Sail to Three Mile Harbor, NY. Stay Aug 21 and 22 in Three Mile Harbor. Cruisers have the option of picking up a town mooring or anchoring in the harbor. This

beautiful Harbor is East Hampton's most popular port with access to marinas, anchorages, restaurants, groceries and more.

Mooring Chair June 2013



Well the unofficial start to summer is here and the boats are starting to appear on the their moorings at the Club. Members are reminded that they are required to submit a new mooring application by June 1st. The application can be found on the new web site under the tab for Mooring Requirements, near

the bottom of the page you will find a link for the form. You can also down load it from State of Ct.

As you read in the email that went out last week there are two new guidelines for the Block Island mooring. Members can now reserve the Block Island mooring in advance, also members will now pay a fee of \$25.00 a night to use the mooring. This fee will be used to defray the cost of mainlining the mooring at Block Island. To reserve the Block Island mooring send me an email with the dates you wish to reserve the mooring, your name and the your boats name. When I receive your email I will verify that the mooring is available, if it is I will place a reservation on the Clubs event calendar with your boats name and the dates you have reserved the mooring I will send you an email confirming your reservation . If the mooring is already reserved I will let you know. If you reserve the mooring and do not use it you are still responsible for paying for your dates. If you stop at Block Island and find the mooring open and use it you are responsible for paying for the use when you return to the Club. As I explained in the email I will use the date and time of your email to determine who gets the mooring if I have two requests for the same day.

The reservation and fee are the only changes made to the Block Island mooring guidelines. Rafting with a boat that has reserved the mooring is still allowed. It is the responsibility of the person who has reserved the mooring to practice good judgment and seamanship when allowing another member to raft with them. If you feel that the conditions are such that it would not be safe i.e. weather, distance to other boats etc... To allow another boat to raft then don't. When you return to the Club let me know the circumstances in the event there is a complaint. Read the guidelines it, describes the conditions under which only one boat can be on the mooring and the number and size of boats that can raft. I hope that more members take advantage of the reservation program to date the mooring has been reserved for a total of eight days.

South mooring field organization. Mark Geer will be moving ten moorings for the Club, they are mostly in the northwestern part of the south field. This is necessary so that the moorings south of them can be placed on their new location. My plan is to use Wednesday afternoon/evenings to move moorings. The first moorings that I plan on moving are those that are at the far south end of the field, we will get them on their new locations and then start moving others. Anyone interested in assisting get in touch with me. All you need are gloves a life jacket and willingness to volunteer.

I am looking forward to another great season.


